He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine.

Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him.

The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.'

**“Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?”**

The expert in the law replied,  
“The one who had mercy on him.”  
Jesus told him,  
“Go and do likewise.”

**FIRST, there was a man who  
wished to test Jesus.**

He was an expert in what the Law  
**SAID**, who was not necessarily  
an expert in what the Law  
**MEANT**.

He was a man who thought that he had the authority to stand in judgment of the very ONE who would someday be judging HIM!

**TEACHING** who didn't realize  
he still had a need to be  
**LEARNING.**

**NEXT**, there was a man who fell  
into great **MISFORTUNE**,  
through no apparent **FAULT** of  
his own.

He was **BEATEN** and left  
without **STRENGTH.**

without **RESOURCES**.

In a day in which some think  
**EVERYONE** is a **VICTIM**,  
and others think **NO ONE** is a  
**VICTIM**, Jesus reminds us that  
**WE NEED EACH OTHER!**

**NEIGHBOR**

**THEN**, there were two  
**RELIGIOUS** men who could  
be expected to be faithful in  
fulfilling their **OBLIGATION**.

At the heart of human  
**RELIGION** is the  
**MANDATE** to fulfill all of  
one's **RESPONSIBILITIES.**

THE  
**MAN**

At the heart of the **EXPERT'S**  
question was a desire to find the  
outer boundary of  
**OBLIGATION.**

THE

*Jesus' answer to the expert's  
question served to reveal  
the very personality and  
values of God!*

THE  
**MAN**

**FINALLY**, there was a  
**STRANGER** who was:

THE  
**MAN**  
WHO CHOSE  
TO BE A  
**NEIGHBOR**

Under not **OBLIGATED** by  
**BLOOD** or by **LAW.**

THE  
**MAN**  
WHO CHOSE  
TO BE A  
**NEIGHBOR**

**ABLE** to assist the man who had  
fallen into **MISFORTUNE**,  
because he had both the  
**STRENGTH** and the  
**RESOURCES** to meet the  
man's needs.

Forced to **CHOOSE** whether he  
would fulfill the  
**OBLIGATIONS** of a  
**NEIGHBOR**, or would  
**PASS ON BY.**
