Upcoming Events



Care 'N' Share is open the 1st and 3rd Wednesday & Saturdays of each month from 10:00 am -2:00 pm, and is a great help as well as witness to the community. They are looking for volunteers, and have a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Center. Shifts are only 2 hours long.



On Maundy Thursday (Apr. 13), there will be a Christian Seder Meal at Park United Methodist Church from 5:30-7:00 p.m. This is an event for the whole family (including teenagers and children), in which we will experience the traditional Jewish Passover feast, and explore how Christ used it at the Last Supper.



On April 14th the tradition of carrying a rough wooden cross through the village will continue with Park Methodist, all are invited, including children. Everyone will meet at the Pulaski Public Library at 12pm, and will finish at Springbrook Apartments. The group will pause to read Scripture at various points referencing events from the Last Supper to the Crucifixion. This is spiritually valuable, and a great witness to the community of what Good Friday means.
